Darling. I have your welcome
note of yesterday which is very dear
& sweet. my leg is better. but still not
free from inflammation & swelling
& makes itch pits as I press in with
my finger. so I shall soon take
this iron. until Dr James is ready for
me. I believe it will be one before God
sails. as his much Charles lets me know
he has taken his passage to do on the
31st to Boston. By the by dear. tell
me to take no money with him more
than two or three sovereigns. which
he can get of John - & repay him on
the other side. if he does - he loses
on his money in getting accounted
from currency to sold to get in here
& from sold to currency to spend it
there. besides he can get what he
wants from Dr [unclear] immediately

in fit to Boston. Besides the letter of
credit is so much exhausted. That is
Cannon afford to take any money
with him. & his much send you a
letter of credit immediately he gets home
which will make you more independent
under any in all circumstances!
Don't father much will be both of you
in sending the credit together. but
it is not well for you. inform. & had
better be separate I am sure.

I find Dad did not see Cannon until
Saturday.

I am so thankful dear dear Baby
has a tooth. what rejoicing. now you
much have his fingers rubbed regularly
with a thumb. - give Babie a common
one to keep in her pocket. It is the very
best & simplest thing in the world
for the purpose - Give the darling a
hundred times. & tell Babie the angels
brought it in return for the pretty dress
I saw her. Ask Sally if a formal letter
is good to her he is so farrish from his

tooth. Bless the darling Miss. I can
see him so distinctly. telling you of
my being ill. Miss them all nearly
thousand for me. They do not know
how I love them. only God knows!
I have 2 months from dear Miss
Peabody. I will have a letter from
her for Dad to take. but I wrote my
note yesterday - a portion of it for
Dad to keep in his pocket book. &
show to any body in America who
questioned my judgment in this
matter. I know I am right darling
at least for my self. & I am naturally
anxious to see myself paid!
I am glad the children have made
friends with the aristocracy (?).
They will be more fun. If you come
away with me to Liverpool why
not take them to Harrogate? But
perhaps they are better where they
are. though I think I should be
of good to Miss. don't Sally think so?
I have a letter from Mabel today
